2013 Alumni Survey Executive Summary

About the Survey:

The 2013 EMU Alumni Survey used the same version as the 2011 Alumni Survey, which was a collaborative effort among the University Advising and Career Development Center, the President's Executive Council, Alumni Relations, and Institutional Research and Information Management. The survey collected information about students' education and career pursuits after they graduated, as well as their college experience at, and satisfaction with, EMU. Seven sections were contained in the survey: (1) Educational Experiences, (2) Jobs and Careers, (3) College Experience, (4) Academic Programs, (5) Competency and Skills, (6) Student Services and (7) Alumni Participation.

Methodology:

Alumni who graduated in the calendar year of 2011 (Winter 2011 through Fall 2011) were identified as the target group of this survey. The survey was administered in March 2013, approximately one year after graduation, by sending out email invitations. A total of 5,105 alumni were invited to participate; 3,184 (62%) undergraduate and 1,921 (38%) graduate students.

The results of the survey simply reflect the opinions of those who responded to the survey and do not necessarily represent the entire population of EMU alumni.

Response Rate:

There were 806 respondents or a 16% response rate, with 457 undergraduate (resp. rate = 14.4%) and 349 graduate respondents (resp. rate = 18.2%). The response rate by college is summarized in the following table.

Highlights of Results:

- Educational pursuit: After graduating from EMU, 34% of the undergraduate and 21% of the graduate students reported having received another degree or enrolled in another educational program.
- 2. The <u>job placement</u> rate was 93%. This number was calculated by adding those who were employed full-time (69%), employed part-time (10%), self-employed (3%), temporarily employed (4%) and volunteering (0.3%) as "employed" divided by the sum of "employed" and "unemployed and seeking employment (6%)." Those who were continuing their education full-time or part-time (5%), or caring for home and family (1%) were excluded since they were "not seeking employment."
- 3. <u>Job search</u>: Among those who were currently employed, 39% held or secured the job before graduation, 33% procured employment within 6 months, 10% within 7-12 months, 8% spent more than one year, and 10% were not seeking employment after graduation.
- 4. <u>Funding of college</u>: The major sources of college funds for EMU alumni were mostly from student loans (64%), savings of parents or relatives (32%), the off-campus employment reimbursement (31%), scholarships/grants (30%), or personal savings (26%).
- Academic programs: Overall, 90% of the alumni reported being "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with their major, which is higher than the 87% satisfaction rate in the 2011 survey. Among those, respondents from the College of Education showed the highest satisfaction.
 - With regards to how well EMU prepared students for their future, 92% of the graduates felt that EMU prepared them "very well," "well" or "adequately" for continuing their education and 88% felt the same in preparing for their present occupation. These results were very similar to the results in the 2011 survey, which were 93% and 89% respectively.
- 6. Most vs. least satisfied: The top three most-satisfied aspects of academic programs were the: variety of general education courses (94% satisfied), quality of courses in their major (91%), and results of their graduation audit (91%). The top three least-satisfied aspects of academic programs were the: information provided about internships, practicum, co-op experiences or career choices (59% satisfied), opportunities to discuss career choices with faculty members (70%), and effectiveness of academic advising in general education (74%). A more detailed comparison with prior year data is listed on page 7.
- 7. <u>Development of skills</u>: Respondents rated their growth of the following three skill areas at EMU with the highest satisfaction level: (1) writing skills (71%), (2) skills to work collaboratively (71%),


- and (3) reading comprehension skills (70%). The three least satisfied skill areas were: (1) leadership skills (55%), (2) civil rights, responsibilities and privileges (57%), and (3) library research skills (58%).
- 8. <u>Career services</u>: Respondents reported that the on-campus job fairs were the most commonly used career services (34%), followed by career planning services (26%), résumé critique or interview advising (24%), and on-campus recruiting (19%).
- 9. <u>Student services</u>: For those who were eligible to use various student services, more than 80% of the users were satisfied with: (1) campus life activities, (2) international student services, (3) community services, and (4) health and wellness programs. Student services which were less heard of or used included the Disability Resource Center, Ombudsman, and the International Student Services.

Survey Results

The following charts are selected items from each section to capture highlights of the survey results. The chart numbering is consistent with the numbers listed on the survey instrument (see page 36).

I. Educational Experiences: Educational Pursuit after Graduation

In this section, alumni were asked about their educational pursuit after they graduated from EMU. The results showed that 28% of the students enrolled in an educational program after receiving their degree. For undergraduate degree recipients, 34% pursued further education, whereas for graduate alumni, 21% reported enrolling in another educational program. Among the 221 (or 28%) students who pursued further education, 41% chose EMU to continue their education.

II. Jobs and Careers


This section collected information from alumni about their current employment status, salary and search for employment. Approximately 85% of the respondents were currently employed, including employed full-time (69%), employed part-time (10%), self-employed (3%), temporarily employed (4%), and volunteering (0.3%).

Among the 8% of the respondents who were not currently employed, 49% were continuing their education full-time, 2% were continuing their education part-time, 11% were caring for home and family, 34% were still looking for work, and 4% were retired or under other employment status.


With regards to the job search for those who were currently employed, 31% were employed before attending EMU, 29% found their jobs through social networking, and 23% were through online job boards. For these respondents, 39% held or secured their first job before graduation, 33% found their jobs within 6 months, 10% took 7-12 months, 8% took more than one year and 10% were not seeking employment after graduation.

Most of the respondents (89%) reported that their current position was related to, or highly related to, their degree major. Comparison among colleges showed that respondents from the College of Education and the College of Health and Human Services were more likely to have jobs closely related to their majors, whereas respondents from the College of Arts and Sciences were more likely to have a wider variety of jobs not related to their major.

The average salary of employed respondents was \$45,072. About 61% of the respondents reported that their salary was within the range of \$20,000 to \$59,999. On average, graduates from the College of Technology reported the highest average salary of \$58,341.




B5: Computed Average Annual Salary

III. **College Experience**

This section asked about how graduates financed their college education while attending EMU, and what their employment and residential status was during college.

Most students reported that the major source of funding for their college education came from student loans (64%), followed by parents, spouse or relatives (32%), or off-campus employment (31%). Most respondents reported that they worked more than twenty hours per week (65%) or part-time (22%) during their last year at EMU. This indicated that most senior-level students may have had financial stress and started working one year before graduation.




C2: Did you work during your last year while taking classes at EMU?

Students mostly commuted to EMU while taking classes at EMU. About 65% of the students commuted to campus for more than two years and 35% commuted for less than two years. Additionally, about 27% lived off-campus but within walking distance for more than two years and only 13% lived in residence halls for more than two years. (Percentages were aggregated from survey results.)


IV. **Academic Programs**

This section asked about graduates' perceptions toward EMU and the academic programs of their degree.





The top three aspects which most respondents rated as very satisfied or satisfied in the 2013 survey were the same as in the 2011 survey, and so were the three least satisfied aspects. However, the three aspects which were least satisfied with had slightly improved since the 2011 survey. Generally speaking, most graduates were satisfied with the educational quality they received at EMU, and expected to see more improvements in areas such as career information and advice, and academic advising.

V. Competency and Skills


This section asked graduates to rate the importance and satisfaction level on their development of competency and skills while attending EMU. The top three rated most important and most satisfied skill areas are listed below. The responses of importance and satisfaction scales used the five-point Likert scales ranging from "Very" (5) to "Not at all" (1).



The discrepancy analysis of importance and satisfaction levels indicated whether student expectations met their satisfaction level. The closer the importance level was to the satisfaction level, the closer EMU met their expectations. If the difference between the two scales was large, it

signified a need for improvement. The largest discrepancies between the average of the importance and satisfaction scales were: (1) time-management skills, (2) leadership skills, (3) problem-solving skills, (4) interpersonal communication skills, and (5) overall competency required for my career.






VI. Student Services and Activities:

In this section, students were asked to rate their experiences with career services, student services and student groups or activities. The ratings included "used it and was satisfied," "used it but not satisfied," "heard of it but never used it," "have not heard of it," and "not applicable." Graduates who selected "not applicable" were not counted toward the eligible users in the following analysis.


For career services, on-campus job fairs were the most commonly used service (34%), followed by career planning services (26%), résumé critique or interview advising (24%) and on-campus recruiting (19%). Forty-nine percent of respondents used at least one type of career services before, 45% heard of but never used the services, and 6% never heard of any career events or services provided by EMU.



F1: Satisfaction of Career Services

More than 80% of the users were satisfied with the campus life activities, the international student services, community service, and the health and wellness program. Areas in which users were less satisfied included the Ombudsman office (50% satisfied), and the financial aid counseling and services (70%).

Students' experiences of student groups or activities showed that most students participated in the following groups or activities, such as Eastern's publications (49%), political/professional/social organizations (27%), and performing arts/music/theater (19%). Among those participants, graduates were most satisfied with performing arts/music/theater (94%), intramural sports (94%), and student government or other leadership experiences (85%).

VII. Alumni Participation

This section was about the level of participation in alumni activities, and the types of information expected from the Alumni Association Office. The results showed that about 38% of the graduates read campus publications and 11% attended alumni functions after graduation. Sixty-four percent of alumni would be interested in knowing more about the alumni programs. Alumni were most interested in learning information such as news about their department or college (54%), general news about the university (40%), alumni events and activities (36%) or upcoming university events (32%).

Regarding graduates' social connections with EMU, 70% reported to have maintained contact with other EMU classmates or alumni, 49% maintained contact with faculty members, and 15% still kept in touch with administrative personnel. Many students have commented about EMU as a community-like institution and were able to build close relationships with faculty members and students in class. In general, the results showed that 78% of the graduates still maintained social connections with students, faculty or administrative personnel from EMU.

Summary of Student Comments

This section contains the qualitative analysis of two open-ended questions regarding student comments about EMU. The questions were:

Q1: Please list one thing you like most about EMU.

Q2: Please make any comments or suggestions concerning EMU.

A total of 407 graduates (or 50.5% of the participants) responded to Q1 and 244 graduates (or 30.3%) responded to Q2. Each answer was coded into one or more of the categories below. In addition, a frequency table of student comments by each category is included, followed by some excerpts from each category. The excerpts of student comments are not meant to be exclusive, but to provide a brief summary of typical student answers.

Academics:

Professors and instructors (135 responses or 26.6%):

- Nearly every faculty member I worked with at EMU was knowledgeable, approachable and very helpful.
- Professional and experienced instructors.
- The ability to have close relationships with professors.

Academic programs, quality of education (109 responses or 21.5%):

- Good _____ program. Supporting and stimulating environment.
- I like the variety in courses and majors.
- The quality of education was high and prepared me for my career choice.

Academic advising or transfer policy (6 responses or 1.2%):

 I had an amazing academic advisor that provided support and guidance during my time at Eastern. The ability to earn majority of credits at _____ Community College and transfer most of the class credits under the MACRO agreement.

College Experience:

Campus climate, diversity, community feel, small class size (121 responses or 23.8%):

- Once you['re] in a program, your peers and instructors are like family by graduation.
- The school is small enough that everybody gets the chance to be involved in their program and the EMU community.
- Desire to improve.

College experience, campus life, student groups, opportunities and activities (43 responses or 8.5%):

- The campus job I had at _____ was the most enjoyable part of my experience.
- The opportunities... I gained so many leadership, personal and professional skills.
- Within my major, the background of students (age, country, years of experience in field)
 presented additional learning opportunities that you wouldn't obtain in a more traditional
 student major.

School Characteristics:

Beautiful campus, facility, library, student center, etc. (41 responses or 8.1%):

- The enclosed campus and improvements made in my time on campus (Student Center, updated buildings, etc.)
- The campus is easily accessible.
- The student center, I made the best of friends there because it was a central meeting point for everyone between classes.
- Utilize the resources at the Halle Library.

Location, satellite campus (33 responses or 6.5%):

- The variety of places for classes.
- Convenience.
- Location of satellite campus.

Affordability (16 responses or 3.2%):

- Affordable quality education.
- Tuition did not go up for a couple of years while I was there.
- It was the full college experience, at an affordable and attainable price and distance.

Other: (4 responses or 0.8%)

Being able to graduate.

Academics

Academic programs, quality of education, program requirements (135 responses or 26.1%):

- Continue to maintain and possibly increase more your academic standards.
- More challenging curriculum and more efficient professors.
- Class scheduling should be more centralized to enhance six-year graduation rate.
- I strongly suggest that more technological elements are incorporated so that students get exposure to eLearning tools—how to create and work with them.
- Providing an environment for building teams in the classroom to prepare for the real world.
- Writing skills should be more emphasized in _____ program.

Professors (16 responses or 6.1%):

- I believe some professors do not give proper feedback to students and elevate grades in order to get tenure.
- The faculty didn't always seem to care.
- EMU needs to put as much money into paying its faculty and especially adjunct faculty as it does into renovating and building facilities.
- Some professors were very passionate about teaching subjects. Others felt like they reached tenure and didn't care to teach anymore.

Student services

Student services, including financial aid, food, library, admissions office, etc. (24 responses or 9.2%):

- Help with dealing with Student Loan Debt.
- More attention should be paid to university housing. There should be more feedback opportunities to solve any problems students may have with the university facilities.
- Better organization/helpfulness around financial aid.
- Our diplomas did not state our major...It looks completely unprofessional.
- Better communication of services available for the students ...who are off-campus.

Academic advising service (21 responses or 8.1%):

- Being assigned an adviser would be helpful than running around to every department... to find out who to meet with.
- There should be a yearly meeting with a professor/advisor specific to your major so that you have a plan each year ...
- The academic counselors were never on the same page for different fields.
- Administrative personnel...provided false information about anything ranging from scholarships to advice on courses ... causing them to have to return for additional semesters.

Career services (19 responses or 7.3%):

- I felt the career advising was extremely lacking. I didn't feel the advisors really cared about my career.
- My college experience was very college oriented but I would have liked to receive more career counseling.
- More events pertaining to job fairs and degree programs.

Buildings and facilities (16 responses or 6.1%):

- A full renovation of _____ Hall.
- Update more of the buildings which EMU is currently doing great on.
- The fact that the _____ department is spread out over several buildings makes it very difficult for students and instructors to communicate/collaborate.

Parking (14 responses or 5.4%):

- Lack of parking makes commuting difficult.
- Parking tags should be available even if you have outstanding tickets.

Campus climate and surrounding environment

Safety (21 responses or 8.1%):

• Make the campus and surrounding areas more safe!

• I was very surprised that [apartment place], where there is a lot of crime, is widely advertised on the campus!

College experience and campus life (9 responses or 3.5%):

- EMU and the Ypsilanti community need to work together to make Ypsilanti a better place for students and faculty. How about an Ypsilanti/EMU master plan incorporating plans for both geographic and social progress?
- Educational and research efforts should be coordinated with other universities in and outside the USA.
- Needs to be more focus on and attention devoted to commuter students.

Campus climate (3 responses or 1.2%):

- I believe that EMU has a long way to go in valuing the role of international students and the wealth of diversity that they bring.
- I would encourage [EMU] to attempt to attract students in more non-traditional regions.

School characteristics

Administration (20 responses or 7.7%):

- Too much bureaucracy and lack of communication between departments and students.
- Administration needs to be organized.
- There needs to be a secure and private system for evaluating classes and professors.
- I would like to see student organizations take over vending as a means of raising more money and keeping more money on campus.

Tuition rate, financial concerns (7 responses or 2.7%):

- Make Graduate Studies more affordable.
- Lower tuition with exorbitant fees just makes it seem like the EMU is trying to trick its student base.

Admission policy (6 responses or 2.3%):

- Low admission standards. Low competition in the classroom.
- Continue the articulation agreements with the various community colleges in the area. I would also encourage EMU to visit the community colleges highlighting these agreements.

Alumni connection (2 responses or 2.8%):

More Alumni outreach programs (job search services/opportunities).

Other

Athletic teams (4 responses or 1.5%):

- I wish that the student body took more pride in their athletic teams.
- EMU would better serve students by investing in academic programs [rather than athletic teams].

Other comments (11 responses or 4.2%)

- ...figure out where to stand within the landscape of the locally available colleges and universities in the area today [and how to] help high school students in transition to college level studies.
- EMU needs to focus more on quality of students and retention rates instead of quantity [...] in hopes that this helps with pride [of EMU].
- More positive information/advertisement about the police department.

Follow-Up Survey Summary

About the Follow-Up Survey:

In order to collect a more representative sample on student employment data, a follow-up survey was administered in June, 2013, one month after the original survey. The follow-up survey consisted of only seven questions regarding employment and job search extracted from the full version of the original survey. Only the non-respondents of the original survey were invited to participate through emails. A total of 236 participants responded to the follow-up survey.

The following report was based on the combined responses of both the full-version and short-version surveys, with a total of 1,042 respondents, or a 20% response rate. The response rates by student level were 18.4% for undergraduate students and 23.8% for graduate students.

Highlights of Results:

- 1. The <u>job placement</u> rate was 93.5%, slightly higher than the 93% from the original survey. There were 71% of the graduates who were currently employed full-time, 9% employed part-time, 2% self-employed, 3% temporarily employed, 0.4% volunteering, 6% unemployed but still seeking employment, and 7% not employed and not seeking employment.
- 2. <u>Job search</u>: Among those who were currently employed, 39% held or secured their first job before graduation, 33% found employment within 6 months, 10% found it between 7-12 months, 9% took more than one year to find a job, and 9% were not seeking employment after graduation.
