# AY2020/21 Graduating Senior Survey Summary and Highlights

#### About the Survey

Every academic year, Eastern Michigan University (EMU) administers a voluntary survey to undergraduate students who are graduating, referred to as the graduating senior survey (GSS), to gather data regarding their experiences as a student at EMU. The survey was initially implemented in 2011, and since then we have gathered a great amount of data and provided useful feedback from our graduating seniors. For the academic year 2020-2021, the response rate of GSS was 38 %. More than 1,100 respondents participated the survey and submitted valuable information. The information gathered through the GSS also presents a more reliable picture about EMU's education and services from our students' perspectives.

During the past academic year, the GSS was administered online during in the fall 2020, winter 2021, and summer 2021 semesters, which also included acquiring information regarding the graduating undergraduate student's aspirations and future plans. The GSS consists of seven general sections: Engagement of Campus Activities, Educational Experience and Academic Services, Facilities and Services at EMU, Sense of Well-Being, Plans after Graduation, College Education Funding, and an analysis of open comments, which consists of things students liked and things they thought could be improved.

The distribution of the respondents and response rates by college are summarized below.

#### Highlights of Results

• Engagement of Campus Activities: Students recorded the most engagement in activities sponsored by the department or school (55%), volunteer work and community service (49%), or in those activities sponsored by student organizations or student government (48%). On-campus artistic performances or exhibitions have a fairly high participation rate (40%). Approximately 24% students have participated in campus recreation activities. Less than 20% of students participated in Greek life (13%) or intercollegiate athletics (16%).

#### Satisfaction with Aspects of EMU:

This part of survey includes 16 questions regarding how satisfied graduating senior students are with 16 aspects of EMU. The formula of computing satisfaction rate is as follows:

Number of (Very Satisfied + Satisfied responses) / (Total responses – N.A. responses) \* 100%

The average satisfaction rate with these 16 aspects of EMU is 82%, which is an increase of one percent from the 2019/20 academic school year.

Students reported they were most satisfied with the variety of general education courses (91%). Results of graduation audit (91%) rises sharply this year, increasing by 3%. Nighty percent (90%) students are satisfied with the intellectual challenge of courses in their major, and the percentage numbers for overall satisfaction with their major and quality of general education courses are 88% and 87%.

Students had the lowest satisfaction with information provided about internships, practicum, or co-op experiences (69% of students were satisfied). Although the following ratings were the lowest among the other categories, three of them still increase in satisfaction from the 2019/20

academic school year: levels of satisfaction with Information provided about internships, practicum or co-op experiences (69%), levels of satisfaction with academic advising from university advising center (UACDC) (76%) and Academic advising from your college advising office (77%).

• Satisfaction with Facilities and Services at EMU: The average satisfaction rate with facilities at EMU is 81%, a 5% increase from the 2019/2020 academic year. A large percentage of participants were satisfied with the Halle Library (96%) and the EMU Student Center (95%). The remaining facilities (7 out of 9) showed significant increases in satisfaction from the 2019/2020 academic year, with average satisfaction rates increasing by five percent. Notably, there was an 10% increase in satisfaction with Athletics facilities from the last academic year (84% satisfaction rate). While most students were satisfied with the facilities on campus, students were highly dissatisfied with parking facilities, with the lowest satisfaction rate (33%) among all facilities.

The average satisfaction rate with services at EMU is 83%, which is a one percent increase from the 2019/2020 academic year. The Writing Center (91%), the SEEUS escort service (90%) and registration process (88%) all showed high satisfaction rates for the students that utilized their services. Students were the least satisfied with food services (71%).

• Sense of Well-Being: Compared to academic year 2019/2020, all but two of the satisfaction items have decreased (less satisfied) by an average of 1%. Overall, 76% of students were satisfied with the quality of the education they received at EMU, increasing 1% from the last academic year. In addition, students' attitudes about their university can be anticipated through their potential referral to others; 69% indicated they would refer EMU to others, which remain the same with last year. The two items with the satisfaction rise (both 1%) were positive interactions with staff in administration services and quality of education they received at EMU.

Plans after Graduation: A total of 772 students responded to the question regarding their employment status, and of those students 33% (252) said they would continue in their current full-time employment and 27% (209) said they would begin full-time employment upon graduation. Approximately 28% (218) of students indicated they are still seeking employment. Of the 328 students who provided information regarding their current or future place of employment, 84% (275) of the responding students reported they are employed within the state of Michigan.

When the students were asked to estimate what they would be doing after graduation, of the 1032 student responses, 59% (603) indicated they planned on working or volunteering full-time, 14% (145) planned to work and continue their education part-time, 12% (127) indicated they were going to pursue further education as a full-time student, and less than 6% (63) reported they were undecided.

A total of 1194 students reported they planned to further formal study in the future. Within these results, 48% (576) indicated they planned to get a master's degree at some point in the future, 9% (102) reported they planned to get a doctorate degree at some point in the future, and 5% (61) planned on earning a professional degree. Nine percent (112) of students reported they planned to pursue some type of certificate or professional licensure and 4% (44) planned to pursue a second bachelor's degree.




Figure 1. Source of funding for college education

College Education Funding: A total of 976 students responded to the question regarding the source of funding for their college education. Student loans were the most prevalent major source of funding at 55% of students, and the second largest source was scholarships or educational grants at 47%. Common minor sources of funding were personal savings (38%) and scholarship or educational grants (32%). Many students reported they did not use employer reimbursement off-campus (76%) or on-campus (78%) as a source of funding for their education. The remaining results are reported in Figure 1.

#### **Thematic Analysis of Open Comments**

At the end of the survey, two open-ended questions with regards to student comments about EMU were asked.

Q1: Please tell us one thing you like most about EMU.

Q2: Please tell us one thing you would like to see EMU improve.




Figure 2 Please tell us one thing you like most about EMU




Figure 3. Please tell us one thing you would like to see EMU improve

For each question, the percentage correlating with the student's response rate is presented below in Figure 2 and Figure 3, each followed by excerpts of student responses within each category.

Q1: Please tell us one thing that you like most about EMU.

There were 625 student responses. Figure 2 is the distribution of answers to Q1.

#### **Academics**:

Faculty, courses (168 responses, 27%)

- "Never had a bad professor. My faculty was awesome and I had great support as an honors student."
- "The professors in my major were terrific. They are strong examples of professionalism and great educators."
- "The attentiveness, motivational push, willingness to help anytime from the professors in my major. It made a huge difference in my success as a student "

Program, college, quality of education (87 responses, 14%)

- "I really liked the variety of courses that were appropriate for my major. It was nice to be able to dabble into different fields and experience a variety of different subjects while under the main branch of my course of study."
- "EMU has prepared me for the work I am doing now and the next phase of my life."
- "I loved the College of HH!"

Flexibility of class schedule or location (35 responses, 6%)

- "I like that EMU continues to offer a quality education for students who also work, and just want to get their degree."
- "The online accessibility."

#### **Campus Climate:**

Services provided, internship opportunities, administrative staff (44 responses, 7%)

- I liked how easy it was to get enrolled and get started. The major requirements were fair--I couldn't have completed it as quickly at other intuitions.
- "The staff is well educated and understands the material."
- "There are many services to help guide students during tough times."

Friendly atmosphere, community-like, sense of belonging (65 responses, 10%)

- "EMU has such a positive and welcoming atmosphere on campus that I had never experienced anywhere before. I spent 4 years studying the things I loved, making life-long friendships and finding new ways to grow as a university student all thanks for EMU."
- "I love EMU because it felt like my second home. The university does an amazing job ensuring that all students feel welcome, connected, and free to explore and be themselves. I have gained many lifelong friendships, participated in experiences and opportunities that have changed my life, and am set up now for success in the field that I am graduating in. I would recommend EMU to absolutely anyone and am 100% pleased with the university."

Small class size, close interactions with faculty and students (35 responses, 6%)

- "I like that the university has the look and feel of a small campus, but it has the resources and energy of a larger campus."
- "I like how small the campus and class sizes are. I also like how good they were with communicating throughout the global pandemic.
- "It is small enough that I can get to know some of my professors."

Campus life, student organizations, student work experience (38 responses, 6%)

- "I could walk out of my dorm, pick a random spot on campus to walk to, and there would be at least one thing going on that I could join and experience either on the way or at that location."
- "I like how the Black community was really close and the events that were put on for us were inspiring and fun."

Diversity of population, student interaction (52 responses, 8%)

• "The amount of international students attending."

• "The unbelievably open atmosphere that the school has to people of all backgrounds. It is a very progressive school that allows people of all kinds to meet and become friends. People that may otherwise never had met. It's a great thing about Eastern."

#### **School Characteristics:**

Beautiful campus, facilities, proximity of buildings (79 responses, 13%)

- "The campus is beautiful and there is always someone around having a good time and willing to help you if its needed."
- "There was always something going on. Library was great for studying.

#### Location (17 responses, 3%)

- "The ability to be completely remote but still local if I ever needed to go to campus."
- "I liked the availability of places to sit in the student center or Halle library--I could find a spot, sit, invite some friends to sit with me, or just study/relax."

#### Affordability (23 responses, 4%)

- "It was affordable for me. Cost was a large factor in determining where I attended school. The
  degree program was also a major factor too. I really didn't have any other choices outside
  degree program and cost."
- "It is affordable and adequate "

#### Students (15 responses, 2%)

- "I loved the openness of having the opportunity to meet students in my program that have the same dreams and compassion as I do."
- "The student relationships I acquired were my most valuable take-away from EMU."

Q2: Please tell us one thing you would like to see EMU improve.

There were 677 student responses. Figure 3 is the distribution of answers to Q2.

#### **Academics:**

Faculty, teaching skills, courses (75 responses, 11%)

- "Speed of grading assignments or providing feedback. Also, greater flexibility in assignment deadlines for working students."
- "Listen to your students when we complain about professors. We didn't make it this far in our education because we complain. Which means when we formally do so to departments head, deans, etc., it shouldn't be taken lightly. There are professors here that don't care about their students in the slightest (academically or personal health) and we have voiced our concerned to heads, deans, etc. to no prevail."
- "Faculty and Staff involvement with students. From my own experience and from the talk of
  others students that share the same thoughts. Majority of students do not know who are the
  Faculty or staff here on campus, it makes it hard to find resources or reach out when most
  students do not see them."

Program, college, quality of education (69 responses, 10%)

- "The nursing department is an unprofessional mess that is unwilling to change when issues are presented and solutions are given."
- "No guidance for premed/ prelaw programming."
- "I wish there was more graduate programs available in Nursing. This is the Main reason as to why I am considering another school for my masters (no FNP program): ("

Flexibility of class schedule or location (16 responses, 2%)

- "I would like to see more classes offered in the evenings and online so people who work full time can have more options."
- "Availability of courses- some classes only offered every other winter semester is annoying."

#### **Campus Climate:**

Services provided, administration staff, financial aid service (117 responses, 17%)

- "EMU needs to improve their general advising and needs to reach out to students more with regard to scheduling classes, making a career path, etc. As a commuter with a job, I didn't really have a lot of extra time to spend on campus to get help with things. I mostly just do stuff on my own, so it's my own fault but still. This last semester, I got a new advisor and he e-mailed me, which is cool."
- "Financial aid was lackluster and the advisors clearly did not care about me at all. There were
  several times where I was misadvised, including one incident wherein I was in the wrong classes
  for almost two months and had to contact the office of the ombudsman for a refund. I have
  never changed major paths, only added a minor, and they somehow still never knew which
  classes I needed for graduation."

Friendly atmosphere, community-like, sense of belonging (11 responses, 2%)

- "EMU is terrible at welcoming all beliefs, views, and races. The professors not only force their beliefs on you, but they don't listen to yours if they differ. I would love to see EMU to openly welcome all students into their school. Their slogan is "You are Welcome here" but on this banner every country is represented other than the country who make up 90 % of the students at the university. I have never felt so unwelcomed at a school that tries so hard to tell you that you are."
- "Stop being so political about everything. This creates a real disconnect for the students who do not hold the same views. When it feels like the whole campus has the opposite view as you and you can't voice your real opinion, that is a real problem."

Campus life, student organization (25 responses, 4%)

- "Abolish the fraternities. They serve no healthy purpose and too many suffer from their existence."
- "Talent show or showcase that involves the whole school not just certain groups."

Diversity of population, student interaction (8 responses, 1%)

- "The housing and residence life is full of racists. They hide behind a smile and a wave but what they do to black RAs is atrocious."
- "I wish our administration respected the needs of our diverse student body and respected our diverse interests."

Safety/law (26 responses, 4%)

- "Their response to sexual assault survivors and trainings received by student staff related to SA."
- "Handle your business when it comes to addressing investigations on sexual assault and rape allegations better."

#### **School Characteristics:**

#### Parking (183 responses, 27%)

- "Turn small parking lots into parking structures. It created professors and students to be late for class on a daily even with parking permits purchased. (In front of Roosevelt hall)"
- "More parking options both at the College of Business and on main campus."
- "Unfortunately, I only attended EMU in person for part of a semester (January 2020 March 2020) so I do not have much experience with the campus itself. However, I found the parking prices to be far too expensive."
- "THE PARKING!!!!!"
- "Cut the price of parking. It is ridiculous to keep raising it especially when many students have bills on top of tuition to pay for. Charging an extra \$170+ just to go to your class on campus is bs. You stole way too much of my money from petty parking tickets. There needs to be free parking zones for commuters. Be like Washtenaw."

#### Campus, facilities, proximity (53 responses, 8%)

- "Bathroom sinks in the business building have the worst design ever. Hands touch sink whenever i was them."
- "I just visited after many years and I brought my family. I was completely embarrassed about the way the area looks. It has gone so far down and I am sure any visiting family would not want their children to go there. Eastern is supposed to be a top school in Michigan. My high school junior was with me as trying to be nice but he said he would never pick Eastern. You MUST invest in the surrounding or at least immediate surrounding area. Not only does it look unsafe but dirty."

#### Affordability, EMU budgeting (41 responses, 6%)

- "Funding going towards teachers and education and not the administration. Salt your sidewalks during the winter. Don't spend money on the entrance of a parking lot, spend it on the parking lot itself!"
- "I wish there was more funding for the music school. The building needs to be upgraded and given the money to properly fix the things that need to be fixed. The faculty and students deserve it."

#### Food (19 responses, 3%)

- "If you could improve/expand food options, that would be great. I hear about a lot of people that get stomach issues from the food across campus, including myself."
- "The food from 2015-2017 was good, after that it was awful, I think something changed about the distributor. There are not nearly as many options as there used to be."
