FTIAC Enrollment Decision Tracking Using National Student Clearinghouse

Research Executive Summary

First-Time In Any College (FTIAC) students have to make an enrollment decision after being admitted to multiple institutions. At Eastern Michigan University (EMU) around 26% of admitted students enrolled for fall 2016. The ratio was similar among all 15 Michigan public universities.



There are many factors involved in a student's enrollment decision including: major, financial status, proximity from home, institutional reputation, and others. It is very difficult to determine which factors and the weights affect students' enrollment decisions. However, the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) can track students' enrollment status with an accuracy level of 98%. It may provide insights that we can use to improve the enrollment of admitted students.

NSC becomes very important to track students, especially the ones who were admitted but enrolled in other institutions. For EMU, it admitted 10,769 FTIAC students in fall 2016. Among them, only 2,808 students enrolled at EMU. According to the Clearinghouse tracking report, the top 15 institutions for students who were admitted but not enrolled at EMU were:

To find the enrollment pattern, we looked at the relation between percent of enrollment of students who were admitted and the ACT composite score. Between 16 and 26, more students preferred to enroll at EMU instead at other institutions. However, EMU lost the competitive edge when the ACT score went above 26.



We further looked at the enrollment in the majors' level to identify the top and bottom enrollment (i.e., admit to enroll conversion) rates among admitted students. The data may imply the majors with high conversion rates (in green) might be unique in the region with good competitiveness, whereas those majors with low conversion rates (in black) may be offered by many institutions in the areas and students have many places to choose from.
