America has a long, painful, and continuing history of social injustice, and this is now particularly divisive. Mathematics is importantly implicated in some of these issues, in ways not widely known or appreciated. Mathematics is a tool sometimes used for oppression, but it can be, at the same time, a resource to disrupt such practices. What is there, then, for an educated citizen to understand about mathematics to help build a socially just society? This talk will explore a few of these topics such as: "Voter Fraud;" Social Choice (the Electoral College); Gerrymandering; Bank lending (Redlining); Payday loans; Bias in hiring; and the "School to Prison Pipeline." This line of inquiry has led to an experimental new course at the University of Michigan.
