DILLMAN SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

(awarded for 2020-2021)

A number of Dillman Scholarships in the amount of up to \$2000 will be awarded each year to upper-class undergraduate students (juniors and above during the award period; current sophomores may apply), from the bequest left to Eastern Michigan University by Mrs. Jessie Dillman. Applicants must be admitted as full-time music majors to an undergraduate degree program in the School of Music and Dance both Fall and Winter semesters in which they will hold the award, enrolled in a minimum of 12 academic hours both semesters, and have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at the time of application.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of a high level of ability in performance or creativity based upon submitted materials. Creativity is to be interpreted broadly, e.g., composition, research, teaching potential, etc.

- 2. Have at least *two* music faculty members complete a Dillman Faculty Recommendation form for you. Faculty members should complete these forms and submit them to John Dorsey by the same deadline.
