



Students in F-1 status may request an extended program end date if there is a compelling academic reason for needing an extension and the student has remaining courses that are needed in order to complete their program. Students must submit the completed request at least 1 month before the program end date on their I-20. Per the F-1 regulations, academic probation and academic suspension are not acceptable reasons for extending an I-20. If the extension is not issued before the student's I-20 program end date, they will have to apply for reinstatement or exit the U.S. and return by using a new I-20 with a new SEVIS ID number.
