Process for Applying

Step 1

Start the DRC Accommodation Process

- 1. Click the link on **DRC Website** and complete the request form.
- 2. Upload supportive documentation (see prior screen) or email to DRC.
- 3. DRC Staff will call or email you once it has been reviewed to set up an accommodation review meeting for your <u>requested</u> accommodations.

FAQ

- Will my High School just send things over?
 - No, but you can request documentation from them so you can upload it.
- When do I make a renewal request?
 - After registration for the next semester.
 - Accommodation letters do not renew automatically.
- How and What does my Faculty Member know?
 - They know you have approved accommodations, not your diagnosis.
 - They access the letter through you or Accommodate.

- Can I be denied accommodations I requested?
 - Before a request is denied, it will be part of a collaborative conversation with the student, faculty member, DRC representative, and maybe Department Head or Dean.
- Can I request updates to my approved accommodations after my initial review meeting?
 - Yes, we may just need additional documentation
- Can my parent or guardian do this for me?
 - They can join you in the meeting with a signed FERPA waiver.
