Types of Documentation

High School

- IEP or 504
- Medical Letter (MD, LSW, LPC, PhD, NP, DO, Mental Health Provider, etc.)
- Neuro/Psychological Test/Report

Higher Education

- Within the last 5 years that states **diagnosis**
- Combination of HS documents and College Lifecycle/Environment letter or document
- DRC 102 Form (EMU Specific)
- Another College Form (If Transferring)

Process for Applying



Step 1



Start the DRC Accommodation Process

1. Click the link on [DRC Website](#) and complete the request form.
2. Upload supportive documentation (see prior screen) or [email](#) to DRC.
3. DRC Staff will call or email you once it has been reviewed to set up an accommodation review meeting for your **requested** accommodations.

Types of Possible Accommodations

(not an exhaustive list of options)

Temporary

- Broken Bone
- Strain
- Twisted Ankle
- Concussion
- Illness (i.e. Long-Term Covid)
- Carpal Tunnel
- Others will be evaluated as requested.

Alternative Media Types

- With appropriate diagnosis and severity
 - Screen Readers
 - Notetaker
 - Sign Language Interpreter

 - Increased Font Size
 - Access to Presentation in Alt. Format
 - Zoom

FAQ

- Will my High School just send things over?
 - No, but you can request documentation from them so you can upload it.
- When do I make a renewal request?
 - After registration for the next semester.
 - Accommodation letters do not renew automatically.
- How and What does my Faculty Member know?
 - They know you have approved accommodations, not your diagnosis.
 - They access the letter through you or Accommodate.
- Can I be denied accommodations I requested?
 - Before a request is denied, it will be part of a collaborative conversation with the student, faculty member, DRC representative, and maybe Department Head or Dean.
- Can I request updates to my approved accommodations after my initial review meeting?
 - Yes, we may just need additional documentation
- Can my parent or guardian do this for me?
 - They can join you in the meeting with a signed FERPA waiver.

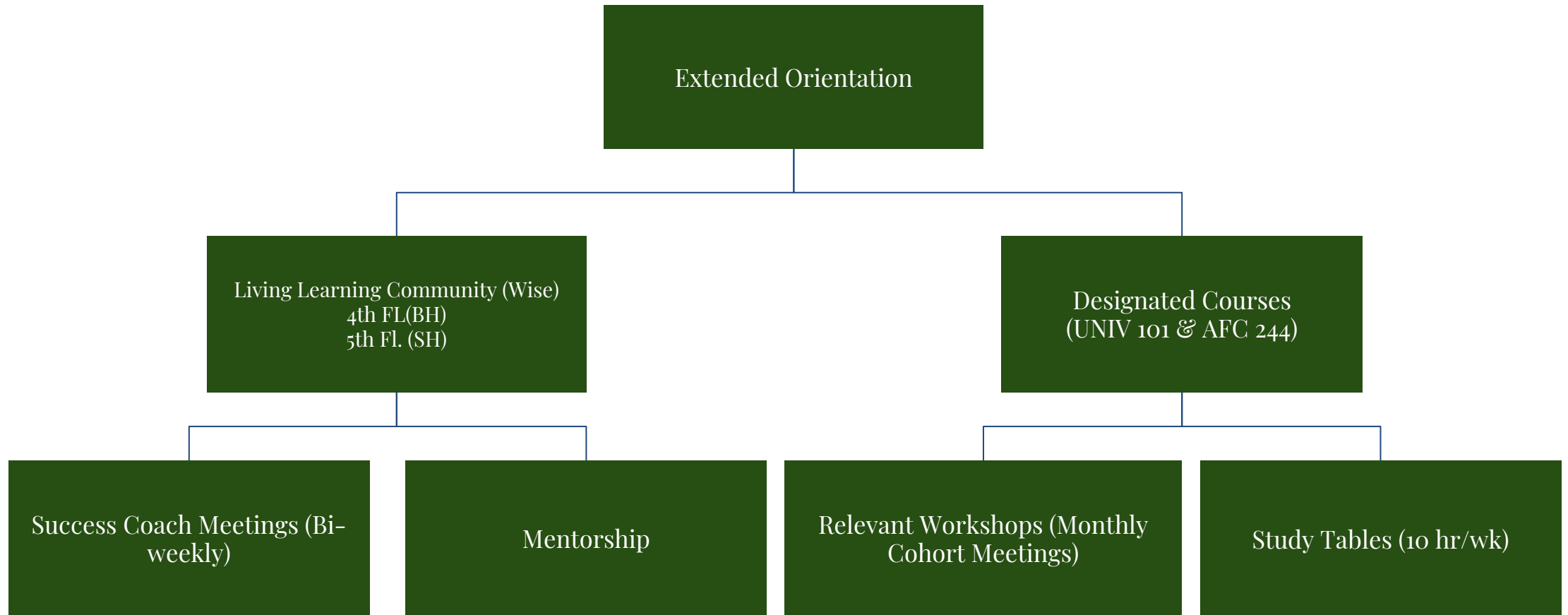

MAGIC is a campus-based support program that strives to increase the graduation rates among Eastern Michigan University (EMU) students who have experienced placement in foster care.

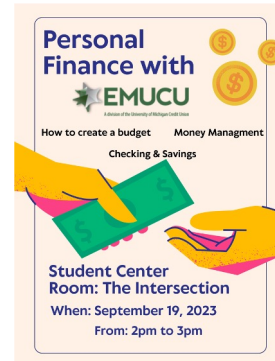
How do we get students to graduation?

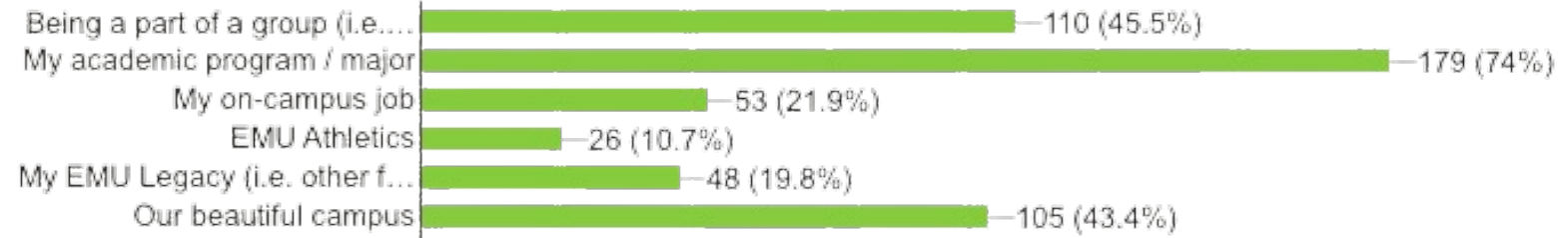
