Russia: You can join us in 2019



In June 2018, nine political science and international affairs majors traveled to St. Petersburg and Moscow for “Russian Revolutions,” a study abroad course taught by Professors Judith

Kullberg and Richard Stahler-Sholk. Through lectures, visits to major historical sites, museums, cultural performances, and meetings with civil society organizations, students acquired a deep understanding of the political and social history, from the Revolution of 1917 through the Gorbachev revolution and the collapse of communism to the present. The overview of Russian culture and history provided context for understanding the complexities of contemporary Russian politics and Russia’s role in the international system. Students thoroughly enjoyed the course and many plan to return to Russia

someday or continue their study of Russian politics and history. Kullberg and Stahler-Sholk are looking forward to leading another group of students to explore Russia’s revolutions in June 4-24, 2019.

Ethan Smith was awarded a Symposium Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) for a project on the global pharmaceutical trade and pricing structure.

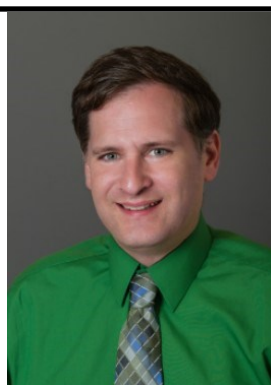
Lily Pellerito was accepted to a U.S. Department of State internship for summer 2019 in Washington, DC at the Office of Central American Affairs.
