What Value Does The I.T. Review Provide?

- > Avoid duplication
- > Review vendor contract
- > Verify data security
- > Assess necessary I.T. support
- Confirm ADA accessibility (Integrated Content)



Remember...

- ➤ Software purchases not allowed on P-Card
- Purchasing will not process without I.T. preapproval
- ➤ If I.T. resources required, plan contract start date around resource availability
- > Please partner with I.T. early in the process



Preferred Name & Pronoun Update

Leigh Greden, Chief of Staff to the President

- Preferred Name: The name a student wishes to be known by in the EMU community that is different from the student's Legal Name
 - Not meant to record a nickname (e.g. Jimmy for James)
 - EMU's policy covers Preferred First Name; Surnames can be changed only with a legal name change
- Pronoun: A word that may be used in place of a person's name
 - Refers to the pronoun that an individual would like others to use when talking to or about that individual

 Student may set or change their Preferred Name and/or Pronoun by logging on to my.emich and clicking on "Personal Information"

 Student then chooses "Update Preferred Name and Pronoun" and follows the instructions

 Preferred names (but not pronouns) may also be declared at a Service EMU location (McKenny or Student Center)

2018-19 FTIAC Scholarships

Kevin Kucera, VP Enrollment

- The core foundation of the EMU undergraduate scholarship program is comprised of the following four programs.
 - Presidential Scholarship
 - Emerald Scholarship
 - Education First Opportunity Scholarship (EFOS)
 - 4WARD Graduation Scholarship
- Eligible students receive only one award. As an example, a student offered an Emerald Scholarship may choose to decline that award and replace it with the 4WARD Graduation Scholarship.

Presidential Sc	Merit Based	
2017 Students	Total EMU Funds	Average Award
78	\$1,711,647	\$21,944

- Qualified students (3.5 GPA, 25 ACT/1200 SAT) compete to receive our largest academic award: a four-year, full-ride (tuition, room, and board) Presidential Scholarship
- Valued at approximately \$90,000 over four years
- Traditionally, 21 Presidential Scholarships are awarded annually
- Application process includes an official campus visit and a competition essay

Emerald Schola	Merit Based	
2017 Students	Total EMU Funds	Average Award
4,963	\$20,531,741	\$4,137

- EMU academic scholarship based on student HS GPA and test scores (required 3.0 GPA, 20 ACT/1030 SAT)
- Awards range from \$2,500-\$8,000
- Renewable for four years with a 24-30 credit hour annual requirement

Students can text in to receive an immediate scholarship estimate.

Education First Opportunity Scholarship (EFOS)

Need Based

2017 Students	Total EMU Funds	Average Award
1,366	\$9,777,609	\$7,158

- Requires 3.0 HS GPA, 20 ACT/1030 SAT and federal Pell eligible
- Renewable for four years with a 30 credit hour annual requirement
- EMU applies federal Pell grant first (average award of \$4,548) and the scholarship covers the difference
- This program has driven significant increases in first-generation college students and students of color

4WARD Gradua	Merit Based	
2019 Students	Total EMU Funds	Average Award

- Beginning Fall 2019, admitted students with a 3.0 HS GPA and a 20 ACT/1030 SAT score may opt into the 4WARD Graduation Scholarship
- Under this scholarship, students pay for their first two consecutive years of tuition at a locked-in tuition rate of approximately \$13,000 per year (30 credits)
- Then EMU will pay for 100% of the next two consecutive years of tuition (30 credits a year)
- Students are required to live on campus for four years at a locked-in rate of \$10,500 per year.

Athletic Schola	Merit Based	
2017 Students	Total EMU Funds	Average Award
571	\$9,937,650	\$17,404

- EMU merit funds, awarded by coaches, are based on student athletic abilities
- Awards range from 25% tuition coverage up to 100% of the cost of attendance (including tuition and fees, room and board, books and personal expenses)

TRUEMU Global Rate

 With the introduction of the TRUEMU Global Rate in June, EMU no longer charges out-of-state tuition to any new undergraduate students – domestic or international.

This eliminates the need for the National Scholars
 Program at the undergraduate level. The NSP covers the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition.


Distance Learning Pricing Model

- RN to BSN
- Bachelor of General Studies
- Master of Arts in Educational Leadership
- Online programs are priced competitively in the marketplace based on AP benchmarking. Students pay less for online programs than for ground-based programs.
- No university scholarships are offered for online programs.




Group Discussion
