REPORT: 2013-14 PROVOST'S NEW FACULTY RESEARCH AWARDS

ACTION REQUESTED

It is recommended that the Board of Regents accept and place on file the Report on the 2013-14 Provost's New Faculty Research Awards.

STAFF SUMMARY

The Provost's New Faculty Research Award offers competitive awards of up to \$5,000 to faculty in their first or second year of employment to carry out carefully designed research or creative projects. The program is designed to help new faculty establish a research agenda that will make them more competitive for external funding. Awards must be expended during the 2014 fiscal year.

The Provost has awarded a total of \$69,920 to fifteen (15) new Eastern Michigan University faculty for research and creative projects under the Provost's Research Award for New Faculty program for 2013-14.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The cost of Provost's Research Awards for New Faculty will be absorbed in the 2013-2014 budget.
