Reese and Jacoby Cup:

Eastern is in 3rd place for Reese Trophy and 4th place for the Jacoby Trophy. The Cartwright Award was named after Carol Cartwright, President of Kent State University and Bowling Green State University. It's one award that is based on academics, athletics and citizenship.

Academic News:

33 Student-Athletes attended the 4.0 Lunch with President Martin and Heather Lyke. 345 3.0 scholar athletes were recognized during a Men's Basketball game. The 3.0 Scholar-Athlete dinner, will be held April 14, 2014 at 6:00pm in the Student Center.

Updated Staff News:

Dan McLean was hired as the Associate Athletic Director, Development. McLean came to EMU after working as the Major Gifts Officer for the Mountaineer Athletic Club at West Virginia University. He is originally from Canton, Michigan. Herb Haygood was recently hired as Wide Receivers Coach for Football. Haygood was the Associate Director of player personnel for the Indiana University football team for the past year. The search is underway for an Assistant Athletic Director of Equipment Operations.

Football Updates:

A video was shown to get a look into Coach Creighton's first 100 days as Head Coach.

Information to season ticket holders was sent out prior to the meeting. Prices increased though we haven't seen an increase since 2005 and at that time it was only \$1.00 an increase. We are now up to speed with our competitors. There are three Reserved sections, sections 104, 105 and 106 and prices are \$20 day of game and \$15 preseason and General admission is \$15.00 day of game and \$12.00 preseason. Chairbacks will also be offered at a price of \$100 plus a \$200 donation either to EMU Football or Eagles Pride. In addition, the Eagles Pride Suite tickets will be offered at \$150 with a \$1,500 donation to EMU Football or Eagles Pride. Also, new for the 2014 season, each non-VIP parking lot has a \$5 charge per vehicle and a \$20 charge per motor home. For VIP parking you will need to sign up for the Eagles Pride Suite level ticket package, which will include free access to the VIP lot.

Development:

Eagles Pride is the annual fund supporting all areas of Eastern Michigan University Athletics. In addition, to your gifts to Eagles Prides, there are additional benefits available to you as well, depicted with the initials E A G L E S.
