## Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents ATHLETIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE Minutes of June 21, 2016

Regent Mike Hawks called the Athletic Affairs Committee meeting to order at 9:35am

#### **Updated Staff News:**

We have hired a new Head Women's Basketball Coach and Staff-Fred Castro comes to us most recently from the University of Washington where their team went to the Final Four last year. He hired 2 of his 3 Assistant Coaches thus far; Adam Call and Abi Olojuwan.

#### **ESPN/CBS Sports Network Review:**

Last year, EMU Athletics was a part of 66 ESPN television productions. We produced 35 events and our MAC schools produced the others. We have 30 students from the Communication, Media, Theater and Arts program who work in the Athletic Department and get real-life hands-on experience with ESPN productions. These 66 events allow for national television exposure for Eastern Michigan University in 99 million homes. When our teams are televised on CBS Sport Network, the exposure for EMU is in 57 million homes. MAC/ESPN Football Review said the overall television ratings for all football games last season was up 8% and MAC games overall went up steadily. College Football Playoff television ratings were down compared to the inaugural year, however the CFP is the #2 sports event in the country after the Super Bowl. It gets higher television ratings than the NBA Playoffs, Final Four and World Series. ESPN completed a bowl game valuation study for the MAC and provided a media exposure analysis for all MAC bowl games. The research was by Joyce Julius & Associates. For example, the exposure value for Western Michigan playing in a bowl game last year was over \$13 million. This includes the national television, internet streaming, news and print news value.

#### **Facility Updates:**

There are several facility improvements that happened over the course of the summer from either fundraised money, game guarantee funds or capital funds. These include the baseball infield turf replacement, the men's basketball locker room renovation, the gymnastics practice room reconfiguration and new premium seating area in Rynearson stadium. The new premium area is called the Eagles Pride Loge and 7 of the 8 loges are sold already.

#### **Student-Athlete Advisory Council:**

A new President has been elected and his name is Chris Cutter and he is a men's swimming student-athlete. Julia Lombardi the previous President has graduated and is starting medical school.

#### **Community Service News:**

On May 21st, the Department of Athletics participated in a department wide community service day working at Frog Island as part of the YPSI Pride Day.

#### **Football News:**

Football season tickets are on sale now and sales are projecting ahead of last year. We have 6 home games for the second year in a row. Two are on Saturday, two on Friday nights and we are on the November mid-week vehicle for the first time and will play on a Tuesday and Wednesday night in November. Five games (three home and 2 away) will be nationally televised this fall. There are two donor trips scheduled for the fall football season. Our "Come Fly with the Eagles Trip" are to Missouri or UNC Charlotte. The package includes the opportunity to fly on the team plane, stay at the team hotel and two tickets and sideline passes to the game. The patio area between the Convocation Center and football field has been named the "Touchdown Terrace" and beer will be available for sale in this area during all home football games. The Department of Athletics presented the confirmed future football schedules through 2020.

#### **Budget News:**

The Department of Athletics presented their FY17 Budget plant, which includes over \$1 million reduction as well as the elimination of 1 FTE. We reviewed the FY16 Revenue report which is not complete yet because there are several NCAA payments that are still forthcoming. As a reminder, the Department of Athletics is transitioning to an auxiliary department in the new fiscal year.

#### **Special Events:**

Maurice Clarett visited with our football team on May 25<sup>th</sup> and shared his unbelievable life story and the lessons he has learned. We hosted the 13<sup>th</sup> annual football golf outing on June 3 and it was the highest attended in the Chris Creighton era. On May 13<sup>th</sup> we hosted the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the 1975 and 1976 College World Series team and had a good turnout of Alumni.

#### Spring Sport Reports - Wrap Up

Spring Sports have wrapped up their seasons and the highlight was our Women's Track & Field team winning the triple crown this year for the first time in school history. They won the MAC Championship in Cross Country, Indoor Track and Outdoor Track. Sue Parks was named MAC Coach of the year. Baseball was 8th in conference after good run in tournament. Rowing ended in 3rd place and both Tennis and Softball need to improve next season.

#### 2015-16 Cornerstones:

The Department of Athletics reviewed their cornerstones for the year, which are all of their quantifiable goals and objectives to summarize what they had accomplished this year. This summer they will set new cornerstones for next year.

#### Highlight Sport - Student-Athlete Support Services-Dr. Talea Drummer:

Talea shared the responsibilities of our academic support services department and the impact they have on our student-athletes' academic and personal development. Along with Dr. Drummer, there is a student staff and 4 counselors divided by sport that assist within the department. We achieved our 2<sup>nd</sup> highest term (3.194) and cumulative (3.252) GPAs in the Department history for the winter semester. 42 student-athletes had a perfect 4.0. 355 (69%) of our student-athletes earned a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher after this semester. 17 of our teams (89%) had a term GPA of 3.0 or higher and 16 (84%) had a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. Women's Gymnastics had their highest GPA in history (3.650). Men's Golf had their highest semester GPA (3.620) and cumulative GPA 93.187) in history. Men's Track and Field had the highest semester GPA (3.130) and cumulative GPA 93.187) in history.

#### **Fundraising Update**

#### FY 16 Highlights

- \$795,820.44 Cash received. Most in EMU Athletics history dating back to when the Foundation recording keeping began in 1981. 45% increase over FY 15.
- Most donors (1,316) since FY 89 (A 27 year high!). 21% increase over FY 15.
- Number of \$5,000+ cumulative giving athletics donors increased more than double FY 15 to 29 unique individuals
- Total Cash/GIK/Pledges \$886,638. 45% Increase over FY 15.

#### FY 17 Highlights to date

- \$244,280 Cash received
- \$1,449,558 in new pledges (Breakdown on following slide)
- · 333 Donors
- EMU Athletics Staff All-In effort underway. Going for third consecutive year of 100% participation. 32 of 78 FTE participated thus far, more than \$10,000 in cash + pledges back to Eastern Michigan.
- Total Cash/GIK/Pledges \$1,696,341. Already 52% ahead of FY 16 total.
