Regent Mike Hawks called the Athletic Affairs Committee meeting to order at 8:45a.m.

Updated Staff News:

Women's Gymnastics hire a new Assistant Coach, Danielle Guider. Danielle joins EMU after coaching at Triad Gymnastics for the last year and serving as the Volunteer Coach at Iowa State from 2011-2016. Mark VanAmeyde has resigned as Head Baseball Coach. We are in the process of a search.

Men's and Women's Cross Country:

The Men's and Women's Cross Country teams both won MAC Championships this fall. For the men, it was the team's eighth straight conference title, tying the record for most consecutive titles. Hlynur Andresson won his first individual championship and represented EMU in the NCAA National Championship. Coach Goodridge earned his 12th MAC Coach of the Year award. The team finished fourth in the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. The women won their third straight conference championship. Four Eagles earned All-MAC honors. Coach Parks was named MAC Coach of the Year for the fourth time in her career, third time while at EMU. The team also finished fourth in the NCAA Great Lakes Regional and received an at-large bid to compete in the NCAA Championship for the third time in program history. Team ran to a 27th place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Academic News:

Our student-athletes recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 83%, an increase of two points over last year's figure, setting a new all-time record for EMU. The GSR is an NCAA measurement that enhances the federally mandated graduation-rate by including student-athlete transfer data in its calculation. The score was boosted by 10 programs that matched or exceeded program record GSR scores. In other academic news, we have had four Scholar-Athletes of the Week and 21 student-athletes named Academic All-MAC so far this year. 35 student-athletes had 4.0 GPA n Winter 2017.

External Relations:

The Championship Building Plan brick campaign continues and over 50 bricks have been sold to date. The Department of Athletics, in cooperation with the EMU Foundation, has launched a new crowdfunding fundraising initiative. Crowdfunding provides a modern avenue to directly support our student-athletes and teams, allowing for improved communication and understanding of how our donors' generous support positively impacts our programs. Our Volleyball program is the first team to embark on a crowdfunding effort, as they look to raise funds for the program's first foreign tour. New programs will be launched throughout the year. This past season, football attendance increased by 6% and was the highest it has been since the 2010 season. In total, 826 season tickets were sold, setting an all-time record. So far, 138 season tickets have been sold for basketball, which is the most since the 2005-6 season. The Education Day game on November 10th recorded an all-time high for attendance for both men's and women's basketball programs. For the fourth consecutive year, Athletics had 100% percent participation in the Staff All-In Campaign. We can't ask for outside help if inside doesn't support, we thank the 86 full-time coaches, staff and administrators for their support.

Fall Sports-Update:

Football won three of their last four games. Soccer is young and talented. Volleyball made it to the MAC Tournament and won the first round. The win ended a four-match losing streak against Buffalo, but it also marked the first win in the MAC Tournament for Head Coach Kimi Olson. Rowing has participated in three regattas this season and Head Coach Kemp Savage was named the USA Rowing Coach.

Highlight Program-David Bolyard-Head Coach Wrestling:

David Bolyard attended Central Michigan University in 2000. He was an All-American his junior year, a four-time national qualifier, received All-American honors and broke a school record by winning 21 straight matches. David Bolyard came to EMU in 2007 as an Assistant Coach and now is in his fourth year as Head Coach for EMU Wrestling. He has coached nine wrestlers to the NCAA championships in his first three seasons. The Team has earned three-straight top-ten finishes in the NWCA All-Academic standings, including first-place in 2015.



- This year, EMU donated 200+ pairs of shoes this year
 and over 1,100 pairs of shoes over the last three years







2017-18 Basketball Attendance

- Actual Gate Attendance
 - WBB averaged 1,016 fans per game
 - This marks the first time WBB has averaged over 1,000 fans/game
 - A 109% increase compared to the 2016-17 season
 - MBB averaged 1,090 fans per game
 - Highest mark since the 2011-12 season
 - A 41% increase from the previous season
 - MBB experienced 7 games with actual attendance over 1,000 fans
 - Student Attendance 1,023 vs. WMU/Glow Night
 - Highest mark since 2004 vs. WMU



2017-18 Basketball Attendance

- MBB ticket revenue increased 13% per game average last year
- MBB season ticket sales increased by 28% over the previous season
- Donor revenue related to ticket purchases increased
 72% across all three ticketed sports
