
The nominations for these individuals have received the support of the Department Head or School Director, the Dean of the College, and the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs.

It gives me tremendous pleasure to write this nomination letter for my esteemed colleague, Dr. Anne Bednar for your consideration in granting her Emeritus Faculty status. I have known Dr. Bednar since 2000 when I first joined the faculty and have been impressed with her level of deep commitment to the Department of Teacher Education, the College of Education, and the EMU community. In all of her 27 years at EMU, she has always been a strong advocate for our students, programs, and legacy.

Dr. Bednar joined the faculty at Eastern Michigan University in 1991 as an Associate Professor of Educational Media and Technology and Educational Psychology. She later became a full professor in 1996. During the last ten years as a faculty member, she made eight presentations at national and regional professional conferences. One of her greatest contributions to the College of Education was serving as the Director of the Educational Resource Center for 14 years during the time span of 1997-2010. As the Director, Dr. Bednar provided exceptional leadership and mentoring to faculty and students on an extensive library of curricular and technological resource materials. She was also responsible for curating and maintaining this set of resources and strived to maintain an updated collection for student and faculty use.

Dr. Bednar has been a wonderful colleague and leader in the Department of Teacher Education. She served as the program coordinator and developed an online masters program in Educational Psychology that met the state standards for advanced programs. She successfully taught undergraduate and graduate classes in Educational Psychology and Educational Media and Technology throughout her tenure at EMU. Dr. Bednar's service to our department, college, and the university has been instrumental in helping the teacher education programs to meet the challenges of the last two decades. She will be missed.

I hope that you will grant Dr. Anne Bednar Emeritus Faculty status upon her retirement as of January 4, 2019. Through her leadership, commitment to students and her colleagues, and her service to our EMU community, she has certainly earned this recognition.

Letter of Support for Greg Huszczo's Application for Emeritus Status

On behalf of the Department of Management Advisory Committee, I am writing this letter in support of the application for Emeritus status in the Department of Management for Dr. Greg Huszczo. Following his active service as a faculty member, Dr. Huszczo is a most deserving recipient of Emeritus status based on the great number of accomplishments made toward Eastern Michigan University, the College of Business, and the Department of Management during the course of his forty-one years long career at this institution.

Dr. Huszczo is an exceptionally well-regarded and respected faculty member of the Department of Management among both his colleagues and students based on his teaching, scholarly and service activities.

Dr. Huszczo scholarly contribution in the field of Management is impressive with over 50 publications, books, edited volumes, journal articles, conference presentations, and conference proceedings that span his entire 40-year career as a scholar and researcher. His articles have appeared in several high-impact journals such as *Human Relations*, *Journal of Labor Research*, *The Industrial Psychologist*, and *Employees Responsibilities and Rights Journal* just to name a few. Dr. Huszczo is not only a prolific researcher who has contributed significantly to the field of Management, but his research interests also intersect and overlap with many faculty within the Department of Management, many of whom he has co-authored with. Although Dr. Huszczo is nearing retirement, his research agenda is quite aggressive, consistent, coherent, and mature considering his vast experience in academia. It should come as no surprise, therefore, that he won Researcher of the Year award in the Department of Management in the 2006/2007 academic year.

Dr. Huszczo is also a great instructor. His approach to teaching combines his caring attitude toward people with a high standard of conduct and achievement. He knows how to motivate his students to strive for excellence. He would do so by communicating course materials in a simple, fun, and easy-to-understand way. He has used various teaching aids to accommodate the different learning styles of his students and has employed techniques that make complex and difficult concepts understandable, and dull topics come alive. This is evidenced in the stellar evaluations he received from students at EMU that resulted in his having won Teacher of the Year Award in academic year 2017/2018.

In terms of his service, Dr. Huszczo's most notable contribution has been his involvement with the MSHROD program which he helped launched in 1978 and of which he served as its Director or Co-Director for 25-30 years. He has also served on many committees at the Department (e.g., Instructional Effectiveness; Advisory, Research Committees); the College (e.g., COB Advisory, and Research Committees); and the University (e.g., Research and Sabbatical Leaves; Bio-Informatics Advisory Committees) levels. In addition, Dr. Huszczo has been our AAUP steward and has served on Bargaining Councils and even on a Bargaining Team and tried to promote a collaborative approach to union-management relationships. For five summers in a row, he hosted a "Book Club" for Management Department faculty at his home, facilitated the Strategic Planning Process for the College of Health and Human Services; the Vision Task Force for the University; Team Development efforts for the Physical Plant; as a Mediator in a dispute between two Centers Directors, and many others too numerous to mention.

Apart from research, teaching and service engagements, Dr. Huszczo is actively involved with the academic community. He regularly reviews manuscripts for academic conferences and high impact peer-reviewed journals. In closing, I wish to reiterate that Dr. Huszczo is an outstanding scholar, teacher, and researcher as evidenced by his many contributions over his 40-year career at EMU.



I am pleased to recommend that Professor Bill Woodland be awarded the status of an Emeritus faculty member. He deserves this recognition for his 37 years of dedicated service to his Department, College, University, profession, and students.

During his 37 years as a professor at EMU, Dr. Bill Woodland distinguished himself as a colleague, a scholar, and an educator. He served the University well in teaching, academic advising, scholarly activity, and service. The following examples are particularly noteworthy:

1. He taught a variety of undergraduate and graduate courses to thousands of students during his career. In particular, for decades he was the primary instructor for our undergraduate Economics Statistics course and his very popular Economics of Business course. His student evaluations were consistently high.

Professor Woodland was a dedicated teacher in both introductory and upper-division courses. Let me give one example of his commitment to student learning. Nearly all teachers of large introductory classes use multiple-choice exams. Professor Woodland always used written exams because he felt that having a student explain an answer better served to measure how much a student truly understood. Although introductory students love multiple-choice exams, they still bestowed high evaluations on Prof Woodland.

2. He served the Department for many years as a member of our Personnel Committee. He particularly did much to improve scholarly standards for tenure and promotion. These improvements helped to both clarify and raise standards.

He served the College as a member of the Research and Sabbatical Leaves Council for many years.

Professor Woodland, along with his wife Linda, served his community for many years as an active fundraiser for the Huron Humane Society.

3. He published a number of scholarly papers in well-regarded journals. He is a nationally recognized authority on gambling markets and market efficiency. He published in two of the top journals in economics: *Journal of Political Economy* and *Journal of Finance*. No one in the history of the department has published in higher ranked journals.

Professor Woodland has been a respected and valued colleague. It is an honor to nominate Dr. Bill Woodland for Emeritus faculty status.

Statement of Support for Emeritus Faculty Status

As a faculty member of Decision Sciences (DS) in the Accounting and Finance Department, I would like to formally recommend Linda Woodland for Emeritus Faculty Status.

The eligibility requirement for Emeritus Faculty Status is serving at EMU for at least fifteen years. Professor Woodland meets the eligibility requirement. She was hired in 1982 and her retirement is in December 2018. Professor Woodland earned a Ph.D. from Purdue University in Economics and has been an exemplary faculty member in all areas of service, scholarly activity and instructional effectiveness throughout her career.

Professor Woodland has been an active researcher throughout her career being very influential in the field of economics. Her publications include some of the top publications in the field, including the *Journal of Political Economy* and the *Journal of Finance*, which are some of the most prestigious journals an academic in economics and finance could possibly publish in. Along with the quality of her publications, she has been an active researcher throughout her career as she has fourteen peer reviewed articles setting a high bar for both quality and quantity. As these publications show she has been active throughout her career. Recent publications continue to be of high quality as the journals, i.e., *Journal of Sports Economics*, *The Southern Economic Journal*, and *Applied Economic Letters* are considered high quality journals according to the ISI (Institute for Scientific Information) and RePEc (Research Papers in Economics) ratings. Her scholarly activity not only shows an exemplary research career, but has also enhanced the reputation of EMU in the fields of economics and finance.

Professor Woodland has also provided tremendous instructional service for EMU during her entire career. As a member of the DS Personnel Committee, I have observed that Dr. Woodland has consistently received a Distinctly Above Average rating for Instructional Effectiveness. She has ensured that the department is known for providing instruction that caters to students needs and setting a consistent standard for academic integrity. Her teaching effectiveness has led to recognition beyond the promotions within the department but also to numerous awards honoring her qualities as an instructor in shaping EMU students' careers and lives. Professor Woodland's teaching awards include the following:

- Recipient, Holman Learning Center, Outstanding Faculty Member in a Supporting Role, March 25, 2002, at the Faculty and Tutor Appreciation Day.
- Recipient, Holman Learning Center, Outstanding Faculty Member in the Classroom, April 2001, at the Faculty and Tutor Appreciation Day.
- Nominee, University Distinguished Faculty Teaching Award II, 2001
- College of Business Faculty Achievement Award for Instructional Effectiveness, 2000

- Alumni Association Teaching Excellence Award, October 1995

Professor Woodland has adapted her teaching methods to adapt to recent technology. Providing students with numerous evaluations of progress and instant feedback through online homework applications and quizzes. Recently, in DS265/501, Professor Woodland provided students with regular and prompt performance evaluations by administering eight quizzes in addition to two tests and a final. She promptly returned all graded materials, reflecting one of her core values as a teacher. In addition, she required her students to use the online homework manager *Connect*, which provided them with immediate feedback on homework problems.

Along with her investments towards students Professor Woodland was recognized as an excellent teacher in her teaching evaluations. This is especially noteworthy since the quantitative courses that she teaches are those in which many students struggle and class GPAs are historically lower than almost all other business courses.

The following excerpts from student evaluations reflect her teaching effectiveness.

- “I learned a lot – relevant real-world examples.”
- “Makes you understand what forces drives markets and industries.”
- “I really learned a lot in this course and felt challenged.”
- “She explains well and is very well prepared.”
- “Examples and class notes were very clear, information was well presented and easy to follow.”

Professor Woodland also demonstrated her commitment to students by such things as: 1) holding “office hours on a regular basis”; 2) helping students by providing success strategies, practice tests, review sessions, tutoring sessions, and informing students of other additional help; 3) assisting “students with academic problems” by the strategies listed in 2) and being available during nonscheduled hours. Professor Woodland’s instructional effectiveness and commitment to students is an example of how terrific and influential an EMU professor can be.

The following excerpts from student emails to Professor Woodland show her strong commitment to the future success of students.

- “Thank you so much for all your support throughout my undergraduate career. I am truly grateful to have met such an influential and inspirational woman like you. You were very motivational ... Because of you, I will be graduating ... from the University of Westminster in London, England with a Master of Science (MSc)(Hons) Finance & Accounting degree with Distinction.”
- “I’m currently a graduate student at the University of Michigan ... I just wanted you to thank you, and let you know that you were one of the best professors I had. Statistics is hard enough as is, but you managed to make it easy to understand.”

- “Please tell Dr. Linda that her grad class (DS605) was the best class of my whole graduate program.” (in an email sent to another professor)
- “Thanks for being a great stats teacher last year. The class was challenging, but I learned a ton.”
- “I can’t tell you how truly appreciative I am to have a Professor who has the same determination t(o) see their students succeed as they do. I’m sure you don’t hear it nearly enough, so thank you.”

Throughout her career, Professor Woodland has provided evidence that she is well-prepared for teaching, practices good teaching methods, is committed to students, and sets high quality standards. She is a faculty member that every department would be proud of regarding her instructional effectiveness.

Professor Woodland has provided a level of service within and for EMU and beyond the institution and in the local community. She has consistently provided service for the DS department as Chair, Decision Science Curriculum/Instruction, Personnel, and Finance Committee. Professor Woodland was the DS265/501/602/605 Coordinator. She was involved in the revision of the prerequisites for DS265 and also was fundamental in creating the two semester DS 250/251 sequence. She also helped write and gain approval of revised DED appointment standards and helped chair the search committee for a DS faculty member in 2009-2010 and the search was successful. Professor helped approve equivalency requirements for non-AACSB (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business) coursework. Her service towards the DS department has been significantly above and beyond the call of duty.

Professor Woodland has also performed numerous service duties for the Accounting and Finance Department. She was an Executive Committee member for the department and helped with the required revisions to the DID (Department Input Document) and DED due to EMU-AAUP (American Association of University Professors) contract changes. She was also the Accounting and Finance Department Steward attending meetings and being a representative on the bargaining council at numerous points in her career.

At the college level, Professor Woodland has gone beyond the call of duty. Professor Woodland has distinguished herself as president and faculty advisor to the EMU chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma, an AACSB business honor society. She has involved the faculty in recruiting eligible students, resulting in increased membership. She organizes and coordinates the activities for the annual induction ceremony. She has created a website and Facebook page to provide information about and create interest in Beta Gamma Sigma.

Professor Woodland has also been a College of Business Grade Grievance Committee Member, and a member of CIMBAC (Continuous Improvement of the MBA Committee) and FAC throughout her career.

Professor Woodland has also provided service which has also been noteworthy at the university level, even in 2007 as part of family day Professor Woodland hosted *Business Statistics in Action!* that used a sampling bowl to demonstrate statistical concepts. Professor Woodland was also part of a AAUP fact-finding team that analyzed the EMU budget. A presentation was made to the Regents, administration, faculty, and students. She also shaped course management for the

university as a EMU Course Management Software Committee Member. She has also been a faculty advisor for student groups such as the EMU Thai Student Association, EMU Tennis Team, and the EMU Tennis Club.

Beyond the university, Professor Woodland has been an active member in both the professional community and the local community.
