STAFF SUMMARY

It is the nature of graduate study music programs that each student is provided an opportunity to concentrate on the specific skills needed for their performance or teaching specialization. Since it is now possible to have official concentrations within graduate programs, the School of Music and Dance has revised the Master of Music degree into a single program with multiple concentrations. This program revision and associated phase-outs brings Eastern's Master of Music degree program in line with the recommendations from the National Association for Schools of Music (NASM), the school's accrediting body.

Upon admission to the School of Music & Dance, each student will meet with the graduate advisor for assistance in planning a curriculum.

Degree Requirements: 30 hours

The Master of Music program requires the completion of 30 hours of course work. A student must earn a grade of a B or higher in all Supportive Studies and Concentration courses. If a grade lower than a B is earned in any course, the student must retake the course and receive a B or higher, before the credits for that course can be counted toward their degree.

Supportive Studies in Music: 10 hours

Students will complete ten hours of Supportive Studies in Music. To satisfy this requirement, students will complete <u>MUSC 500</u> - <u>Introduction to Graduate Studies</u>, and eight additional hours of coursework distributed among the music theory and music history courses listed below, and in some cases other courses not listed. *The specific requirements are determined by the student's concentration*.

Each student must achieve an acceptable score (70% or higher) on the Music Theory Graduate Placement Exam before enrolling in any of the Music Theory courses. The Music Theory Graduate Placement Exam may be taken only one time.

Students who fail to achieve an acceptable score must complete <u>MUSC 509.- Graduate Theory Review</u> (2 hrs) with a B or better, prior to enrolling in the music theory courses listed below. Students placed into MUSC 509 are allowed to take the course only one time. Any student who does not earn a B or better in the course, will not be allowed to continue in the graduate program.
