Unique Partnerships

- Nursing Collaborative
 - Earn associate degree in nursing and bachelor degree simultaneously
 - Washtenaw Community College
 - Henry Ford College
 - Monroe County Community College
- MICUP – BEAT
 - King Chavez Parks Initiative dedicated to supporting underserved students as they transition from a community college by providing mentoring, academic preparation, financial education and scholarships
 - MICUP Grant with Henry Ford College and Wayne County Community College
 - BEAT open to all students

Unique Partnerships

- **MiTransfer Pathways**
 - 2018-2020, collaboration between 2 and 4 year colleges in Michigan
 - 10 academic pathways (including Biology, Mechanical Engineering, Art, Social Work)
- **Futures for Frontliners**
 - The initial program is a state funded scholarship to essential workers, to enable the worker to obtain a tuition-free associate degree at a MI community college
 - EMU has created a scholarship combined with federal funds to encourage essential workers who would like to continue their education and earn a bachelor degree, tuition-free

Foundations of Excellence Transfer

- **Initiative through the John N. Gardner Foundation**
 - Enhancing the transfer student experience and student success and raising the awareness of transfer students on campus
- **53 members of the campus community**
 - 9 committees focused on different aspects of the transfer experience
- **Began self study in fall 2019**
 - Surveys in fall 2019 to EMU students, faculty and staff and community college partners in spring 2020
 - Committee analysis of the aspects of transfer and recommendations

 - 26 priority recommendations
 - Support of the administration and campus community
- **Implementing recommendations**
 - Transfer Advisory Board Committee
