#### HONORARY EMERITUS STATUS FOR MERITORIOUS SERVICE

### **ACTION REQUESTED**

It is recommended that the Board of Regents grant Honorary Emeritus Status for Meritorious Service to John Donegan, who provided exceptional leadership in his role as Vice President of Operations and Facilities for over 13 years and while serving as a University consultant following retirement.

John continuously devoted himself to initiative after initiative throughout his career. During his time at the University. John was an advocate for developing strong relationships with other Universities throughout the state of Michigan and strengthening our relationships with local Government Agencies. He activated membership of MiAPPA (Michigan Association of Physical Plant Administrators). It is because of John's enthusiasm for getting involved that joint projects were developed with MDOT, WATS. Washtenaw County Parks and DPW of Ypsilanti resulted in the Board-to-Board (B2B) trails on and around campus, the Washtenaw and Oakwood intersection, and the HAWK system on Washtenaw. John was involved in the renovations of Mark Jefferson, Pray-Harold. Sill Hall, Strong Hall, Indoor Practice Facility, REC/IM, Co-Generation Installation and the EMU/IHA Wellness Center, just to name a few. John had a commitment to reaching beyond campus to bring visibility to EMU through his involvement while encouraging similar participation among his employees.

### STAFF SUMMARY

Candidates for honorary emeritus status must have a significant number of years of service and a record of meritorious performance in one or more of the following: (a) a substantive record of scholarly achievement commensurate with national or international standards within the specific discipline. (b) a record of outstanding teaching and or educational contributions, (c) clear evidence of service to the University beyond the normal expectations, (d) clear evidence of exceptional institutional leadership, advancement of the University or extraordinary service to students.

I am writing you today in support of John Donagen's appointment to honorary emeritus status for his service as Vice President of Operations and Facilities. When John started his career at Eastern, he made it known that before he accepted the position, he came to campus with Karen to look around. He wanted to see what he was getting into. John saw a well-established campus with good bones, but it was rough around the edges and worn in the middle. John saw the potential and thus started his career at EMU.

John wanted the grounds of the university to reflect an identity for the campus. The steps for this process were developed over countess hours walking and driving around the campus, all leading to a new set of standards created for the landscaping of the campus. These new standards encompassed fencing, signage, sidewalks, wayfinding, landscape designs, exterior lighting, campus land use, retaining walls etc. The new standard being reflective of Southeastern Michigan called for the use of rocks and boulders (instead of concrete) in the landscape around the campus and has ended up creating the phrase "Donagen Rocks" which has been added to the campus vocabulary.

John was an advocate for developing strong relationships with the other Universities throughout Michigan and strengthen our relationships with our local Government agencies. This relationship was critical during the start of the Pandemic, where the State University Physical Plants maintain communications on product and equipment testing, that saved us all a lot of time and money. The B2B (Board-to-Board) trails on an around campus, Washtenaw and Oakwood intersection, and the HAWK system on Washtenaw are all joint project around the campus developed with MDOT, WATS, Washtenaw County Parks, and DPW of Ypsilanti. During John's career at Eastern, all the projects around campus both big and small are too numerous to list.

John was passionate about the appearance of the campus, and he should be proud of all that was accomplished under his leadership.
