The Athletic Affairs Committee meeting was called to order at 9:32a.m.

Fall/Winter Sports Update:

Athletic Affairs began with a recap of the fall sports season, highlighted by our Women's Cross Country team finishing in second place at the MAC Championship and sixth place at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, our highest finish since 2018. Between our Men's and Women's Cross Country teams, four student-athletes earned All-MAC honors. Football won its last two regular-season games to become bowl eligible for its sixth bowl game under Coach Creighton's leadership. This is the first time in program history that the Eagles are bowl eligible for a third consecutive year. The Soccer Team finished with and overall record of 1-12-6 and a Mid-American Conference record of 1-8-2. It was a tough year, but their future is bright with a coaching change as Coach Scott Hall retired after 25 years. The Volleyball program finished with an overall record of 5-25 and a Mid-American Conference record of 3-15. This was the first season under Head Coach Kevin Foeman who was hired in the spring. We are looking for much improvement over the new few years.

Basketball season has started and the men's team is off to a 5-3 start and a 3-0 record at home, the women have been on the road and have a record of 2-5 on the season. The Swimming and Diving team have had five dual meets and one invitational. They finished second in the Denison Invitational in Ohio.

Development Updates:

A review of the FY23 fundraising efforts were shared with the committee, along with an FY24 fundraising update. 1.3 million new money in the door. From July 1, 2023 – October 31, 2023 This fall semester, we hosted the E-Club Athletic Hall of Fame induction ceremony, All-Sports Reunion in conjunction with EMU Homecoming, celebrated the successful fundraising campaign of the Ben Braun Court Naming Campaign and also supported the University's Giving TrueDay efforts. Dan McLean highlighted the generous gift from Regent Emeritus Phil Incarnati that will be honored in the renaming of the Student-Athlete Performance Center to the Incarnati Athletic Center. Crowdfunding is underway for various sports: Baseball is fundraising for the TrackMan software system, Lacrosse is fundraising for extra low impact training equipment and Gymnastics is fundraising for new enhanced and updated equipment.

Academic Update:

Student-Athletes continue to work hard in the classroom, earning a 3.382 cumulative GPA at the end of the Winter 2023 semester, the highest departmental GPA since 1999. In total, 78% of our Student-Athletes achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and all of our teams had a 3.0 or higher team GPA in Winter 2023. We are graduating 89% of our Student-Athletes. These students have had a record breaking semester in regards to community service hours and DEI events.

External Relations:

We experienced an increase in football season ticket sales, as well as single game and overall revenue. Many of the new fan engagement areas within Rynearson Stadium, which included field suites, an enhanced kids zone and enhanced concessions offerings, were well-received by fans. With basketball season underway, fans can also expect to see similar enhancements inside the George Gervin GameAbove Center throughout the winter. We also put in place new safety measures such as the clear bag policy and added metal detectors. We have many facility projects underway, the Golf Performance Center, George Gervin Statue, Gymnastics Locker Room, Baseball indoor hitting space, GameAbove Film Room, Student-Athlete lounge and Rowing Suite formerly the Football Team Room. Andy Rowdon went on to thank Chris Grant, Scott Storrar, Kaye Sekerak and Chris Longerbeam. Without them none of these projects would be possible.

Championship Building Plan Phase 2:

Phase One was the Student-Athlete Performance Center that was a \$20 million facility that was completed in 2019. Athletic Director Wetherbee shared an overview of the proposal for the second phase of the Championship Building Plan. At the Board Meeting today we will have three projects requested for approval from the board including resurfacing Rynearson stadium to include the removal of the track. We are also planning on building a new outdoor track for our Track & Field programs near Westview Apartments. Lastly, we will update Oestrike stadium with a new concourse and main entry.
