New Academic Standing Policy

- How is cumulative completion rate (CCR) calculated?
 - Cumulative completion rate (CCR) is calculated by dividing the number of EMU credits earned by the number of EMU credits attempted.
 - Example: $\frac{125}{131}$ (earned hours) \div $\frac{131}{131}$ (attempted hours) = 95%.
 - Your Completion Rate: $\frac{\text{earned hours}}{\text{attempted hours}} = \text{completion rate} \%$

- How might I improve my CCR?
 - Meeting with an academic advisor as soon as possible to review your specific academic record is the best course of action. There are, however, some general tips.
 - Successfully complete all of your current (winter 2013) courses.
 - Successfully complete any prior courses in which you received an I, N or IP grade.
 - Considering enrolling in, and successfully completing, late starting winter 2013 courses and/or summer 2013 courses.

- Where can I see my CCR?
 - Your CCR can be seen in your my.emich account.
 - Log in to my.emich
 - Choose Student Tab
 - Choose Student Services link
 - Choose Student Records link
 - Choose Supplemental Advising Information link
 - Choose Undergraduate level

- If I am a second bachelor or post-bachelor student, is my CCR calculated any differently?
 - Only courses attempted since the first degree are considered for students who are pursuing a second undergraduate degree from EMU. You must still have a CCR at/above 67% and a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

- Will the warning status show on my transcript?
 - While the status will show on your unofficial my.emich transcript, academic standing does not, and will not, be reflected on official transcripts.

- Can I still graduate if my completion rate is below 67%?
 - There will be no current impact on graduation eligibility; graduation requires you have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0, as well as a minimum 2.0 grade point average in your major(s) and minor(s) but does not require a minimum CCR.

- Can I still enroll and take classes if I am in warning status?
 - Yes. Warning status does not impact your ability to take classes, but highlights the fact that you will need to be watchful of your CCR.
