

## The Marilyn Horace-Moore Scholarship

2022-2023

### ABOUT THIS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is named in honor of Marilyn Horace-Moore, who was a vital member of the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminology, at Eastern Michigan University, from 1994 until her passing in 2020. Horace-Moore routinely taught courses in criminal justice and policing within the Criminology and Criminal Justice program. She was the first Black female police officer to serve undercover for the Ypsilanti Police Dept and Michigan State Police. She was the first Black woman to attain the rank of Lieutenant in the Ypsilanti Police Department. She also served as Academic Advisor for the Criminology and Criminal Justice programs and was Coordinator of the Internship Program. Before becoming a member of the EMU community, Marilyn Horace-Moore was a police officer with the Ypsilanti Police Department, from 1973-1994, retiring at the rank of Lieutenant.

The Marilyn Horace-Moore Scholarship is one award, given to one student, in the amount of **\$400.00**. The Scholarship will be awarded no later than April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and will be deposited into the recipient's EMU student account for the Fall 2021 term.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Any student who meets the following criteria is eligible to apply for this scholarship:

- ❖ A registered student who has declared their major in Criminology and Criminal Justice (CRM);
- ❖ Intend to register for the Fall 2021 term; and
- ❖ Has achieved a minimum of 60 credit hours (with no maximum) at the time of scholarship application.

*Preference* will be given to applicants who articulate in their essay how the Scholarship:

- ❖ Will enable the recipient to pursue a career in law enforcement (but applicants considering other careers in criminal justice are also eligible); and

- ❖ Will address a specific financial need, such as completing coursework during the Fall term immediately following the Scholarship award.

## HOW TO APPLY

Interested students must complete an application, consisting of:

- ❖ The applicant's EMU transcript (unofficial copies accepted);
- ❖ A 2-4 page essay (double-spaced, 12 pt. font, 1 inch margins) explaining how the Scholarship will enable the applicant to (1) pursue a career in law enforcement or related criminal justice field; (2) how the award will address a specific financial need, such as completing coursework during the Fall term immediately following the Scholarship award; and
- ❖ A completed application form (see below)

An application—consisting of the transcript, essay, and an application form—must be **emailed** to the Chair of the Department of Sociology, Anthropology and Criminology (**Dr. Julian Murchison: [jmurchi1@emich.edu](mailto:jmurchi1@emich.edu)**) by **Monday, March 7, 2022, at noon**. The recipient also agrees that EMU may use his or her name in publications or press releases related to the grant related event or the scholarship.
