Basic eligibility requirements that apply to all scholarships:

- Minimum 3.0 cumulative EMU grade point average.
- Full-time EMU undergraduate student (12 credit hours per semester) for the fall and/or winter terms of the following academic year.

Just ONE application allows for submission and consideration, as eligible, for all of the following:

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Complete application form.
- Submit a brief resume, including collegiate academic history and honors, employment experience, special recognition, and volunteer activities.
- Applicants are asked to submit an essay of **NO MORE** than 2 type-written, double-spaced pages addressing:
 - 1) Briefly (1 paragraph) outline your symposium project and identify your faculty sponsor. Remember to write for a general, not discipline-specific, audience.
 - 2) In the body of the application essay (not to exceed 2 pages), pick 3-4 of the following points to reflect upon and discuss in more detail:
 - What portion of the project was original research?
 - As a result of this project, what related questions do you propose to research in the future?
 - How did this project changed or influenced your perspective on the discipline?
 - Reflect on the experience of working with your faculty mentor?
 - Why did you choose this topic? How does it reflect your personal goals?
 - Describe a revelatory moment or experience associated with this project.
 - Through this Symposium, how did you experience the diversity of disciplines?

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

- Students should show through their application materials their academic excellence and the value of the Symposium experience.
- Applications will be reviewed by a sub-committee of the Symposium Planning Committee.

Awards will be applied to recipients' student accounts upon verification of undergraduate enrollment (minimum 12 credit hours during fall 2017 and/or winter 2018) meeting the eligibility requirements of the scholarship. The Office of Financial Aid will determine if any adjustments are needed to previously offered student loans as a result of this award.
