

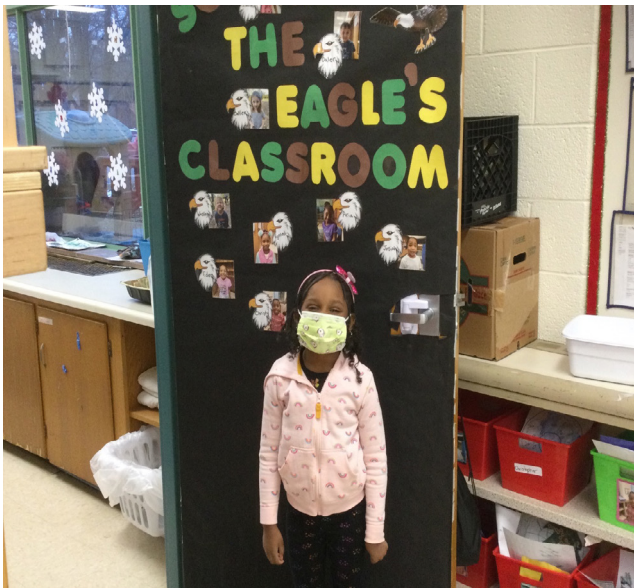

UWWC has played a critical role in the success of many new programs EMU has launched in Ypsilanti. They provide resources and funding in the areas of financial empowerment, mental health and wellness for EMU's Family Empowerment Program (FEP) which supports individuals and families in the Ypsilanti Housing Commission communities through resource navigation and community building in order to foster self-sufficiency and enhance quality of life.

UWWC also supports local organizations that provide critical services to EMU students and staff. These include the Collaborative: YMCA Early Childhood Development Center, which provides low-cost high-quality childcare for EMU students with children; Corner Health Center, which provides full spectrum healthcare for young people up to age 25 and their children; Hope Clinic which is instrumental in providing free dental and medical care and food to our most vulnerable community members, and Ozone House, which provides safety and security for homeless youth and those aging out of foster care.

In our community, UWWC is the key partner that provides the early strategic investment that makes a difference every day. When you give to United Way, you know your gift will make a difference to our EMU, Ypsilanti and Washtenaw County communities.

United Way of Washtenaw County partners with TrustPlus to provide one-on-one financial coaching to help clients build their credit, reduce debt, and increase savings.



The call center handles more than 6,000 local calls annually from people seeking social service assistance, free of charge.



The Volunteer Center connects passionate volunteers with more than 250 local agencies and their in-person volunteer opportunities. Our volunteers donated over 5,000 hours of their time, equivalent to \$154,569 in donated time and talent!



Catchafire connects local talented professionals looking to give back with nonprofits across the nation, looking for skilled, virtual volunteers. Volunteer opportunities include marketing, web development, operations, strategy, and more.



The VITA program connects tax-prep volunteers with low-to-moderate income Washtenaw County residents for FREE. In 2021, we prepared over 650 tax returns totaling over \$1.42 million in refunds.
