Our Relief Fund, Community Recovery Fund, and State of Michigan Rapid Response grants provided unrestricted operating support to local human service nonprofits and community groups meeting immediate, emergent, and unanticipated needs of people and communities impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Our Impact: By the Numbers

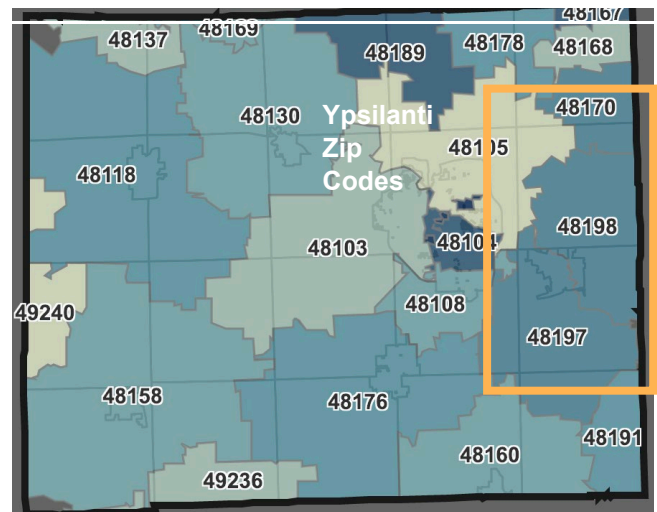
- **\$1,627,500:** Total funding awarded
- **74%:** Funding to Ypsilanti zip codes 48197/98
- **20%:** Funding to rural Washtenaw County
- **99:** # of grants awarded
- **73%:** Funding explicitly serving communities and people of color
- **52%:** Grants to agencies led by people of color

Our Commitment to Equity

Prioritizing response efforts that attend to racial inequity remains a central tenet in United Way's grant making as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to reveal the disproportionate impact of this virus on people and communities of color.

Grant awards were prioritized to organizations led by people of color and those serving: 48197/98, rural communities, communities of color, people with low-incomes, and other systematically marginalized groups.

COVID-19 Cases by Zip Code

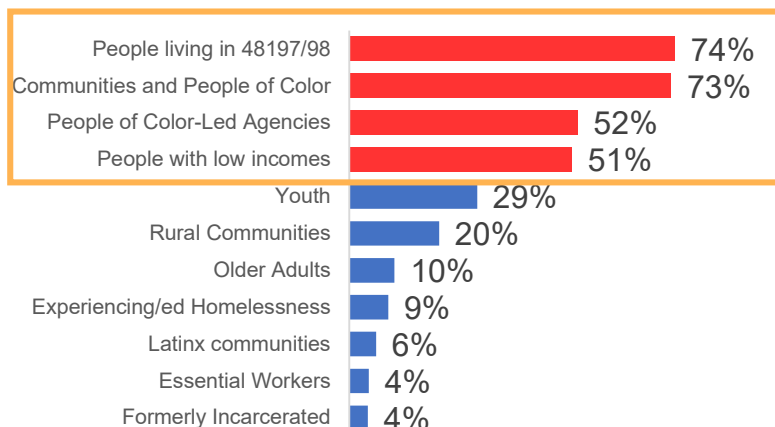

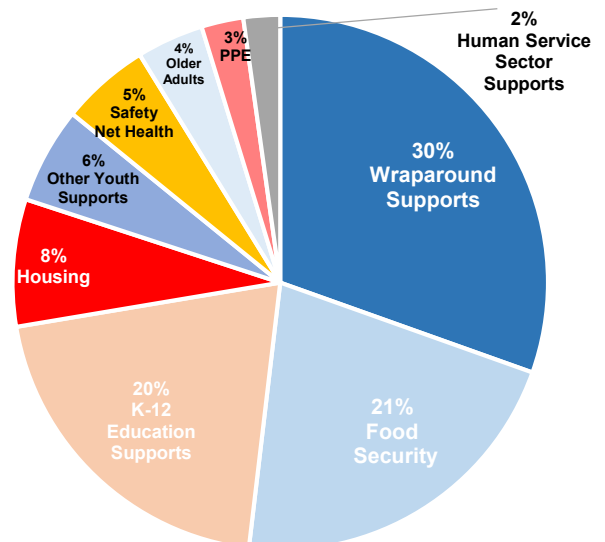
