These include the Collaborative: YMCA Early Childhood Development Center, which provides low-cost high quality childcare for EMU students with children; Corner Health Center, which provides full spectrum healthcare for young people up to age 25 and their children; and Ozone House, which provides safety and security for homeless youth and those aging out of foster care.

Our Mobile Financial Resource Team works with low-income individuals on how to manage money, eliminate debt and plan for the future.

In 2018, our free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance clinic prepared over 1000 tax returns for low-income Washtenaw County residents totaling over \$1.5 million in refunds.
